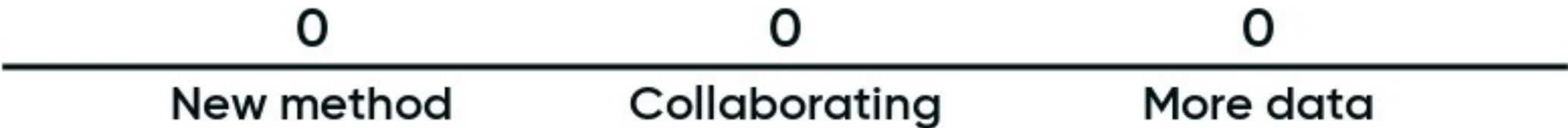

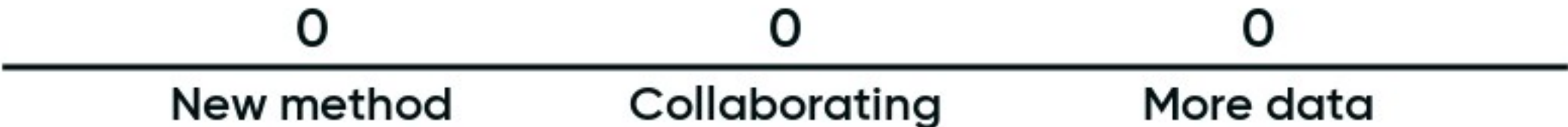

Reflective

Great things can be achieve through greater collaboration

There is much more potential for sharing human security data with other NGOs than I thought..:

It's ultimately about people, not about technology

Importance of this topic

Sharing data is not enough, I need to include ways to act towards PKOs

Collaboration is key, both in terms of data collection as well as analysis and implementation

Keep in mind big brains and small hands

What is one key lesson that you will take away from today?

Knowing is not the same as understanding.

That the key to partnering on data is matching what we can understand with what peacekeeping can realistically do about it

Information is unfortunately often too sensitive for sharing publicly

It is important to translate data into actionable analysis

Experience from the field has to be taken into account

Need political will

Data helps, but it's about people

Mindset to share information can only be shared in a collaborative institutionalized approach

Information is not the same as data
