










HOW WOULD YOU RATE YOUR PERSONAL SE-CURITY SITUATION IN THIS COMMUNITY?





WHAT DO YOU EXPECT TO HAPPEN WITH SECURITY IN YOUR COMMUNITY IN THE **NEXT YEAR?**




31.3% of respondents believe they will be vulnerable to violence in the next year



95.8% of respondents reported that they believe that HAS members protect civilians and do not cause them harm




















DOES THIS ACTOR HAVE A CONSISTENT PRESENCE IN YOUR COMMUNITY?





HAVE YOU OBSERVED ANY ENVIRONMENTAL CHANGES IN YOUR AREA IN THE LAST 12 MONTHS?




HOW HAVE WATER-RELATED PROBLEMS CAUSED UNREST IN YOUR AREA IN THE LAST 12 MONTHS?














WITH WHICH STATEMENT DO YOU AGREE MOST?





HUMAN SECURITY SURVEY METHODOLOGY

Over a period of 3 weeks in March 2023, **14** enumerators conducted **751** face-to-face interviews across all 6 districts of Diyala Governorate using a standardized survey script. For more details on how HSS data is collected and analysed, view our <u>methodological note</u>.

Taking into account the most recent population estimates, respondent targets were set with the aim of a representative distribution across gender, district, subdistrict, and urban/rural areas. Communities, households, and individual respondents were selected to participate through a systematic and approximately random procedure to increase the likelihood of generalizability.

The Wand Al-Khair organization, trusted long-time partner of PAX will continue its work in Diyala through **community engagement activities** with civilians, authorities, and a multitude of security actors to improve the local security situation using the results of the Human Security Survey.
