





Introduction

The <u>Human Security Survey</u> (HSS) is a unique survey methodology developed by PAX, that includes a series of complementary activities, including population-based research, active community engagement, and advocacy. In practice, the HSS collects security perspectives of local community members through randomized household surveys on an annual basis. Throughout 2023, Between **14** and **17** enumerators conducted **712** interviews in Salahaddin, **682** interviews in Kirkuk, and **751** interviews in Diyala using a standardized survey script. 

Methodological Notes

- Please note that survey questions can be divided into 'select one' [respondents can only make one choice] and 'select multiple' [respondents can make multiple choices] questions. A comment is added where possible to specify the question type.
- The total number of responses (N) provided for a question can be found in either the header of the tabulated question, or as part of the visualization. With this in mind, 'select multiple' questions may have a higher/lower 'N' value than the actual number of survey respondents. Some questions also depend on responses to prior questions, or certain conditions, this can further influence the 'N' value.
- Percentages are calculated by 'column'. For example, 14.9% (N = 106) of all respondents in Salahaddin (N = 712) selected the option 'No formal schooling completed', when answering the question 'What is the highest level of schooling that you have completed ' [As seen in the table to the left]. The sum of percentages by column will add up to 100%.




