

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














HUMAN SECURITY SURVEY METHODOLOGY

During 3 weeks in February 2022, **14** enumerators conducted **437** face-to-face interviews across 3 counties of Jonglei State using a standardized survey script. For more details on how HSS data is collected and analyzed, view our <u>methodological note</u>.

PAX will return to Jonglei for a data presentation and community dialogue meeting to formulate an action plan to improve the local security situation.



PAX will continue to monitor the local security dynamics in Jonglei through the Expert Panel
Monitor until the HSS returns for another data collection round in 2023.
