












## WHAT ARE THE MOST SIGNIFICANT CHANGES NEEDED TO BRING LASTING PEACE TO SOUTH SUDAN?





#### HOW HAS THE IMPROVED SECURITY SITUATION IMPACTED YOUR DAILY LIFE?




#### **HUMAN SECURITY SURVEY METHODOLOGY**

During 3 weeks in May 2022, 13 enumerators conducted 588 face-to-face interviews across 2 areas of Payinjiar County using a standardized survey script. For more details on how HSS data is collected and analyzed, view our methodological note.
